

Roles and Functions of Uncle Ho Soldiers in Official Communication Topics

Abstract

The main established relationship/communication role of Uncle Ho's soldiers in the collective is mainly a powerful role. The friendly role appears but is only expressed in the CS peer pair in the context of formal communication with low legality, with 3 novels, 8 short - medium stories, 5 memoirs to conduct a survey, classifying and analyzing communication topics in the official communication of Uncle Ho soldiers on the following aspects: communication topics of upper and lower roles; communication topics of horizontal (peer) pairs. The results show that: The pair of soldier-soldier roles (CS - CS) is a pair of roles reflecting the relationship between soldiers and soldiers based on the background of responsibility and duty. These are roles that have a low level of power and the potential to transition into a friendly role. This is one of the other unique characteristics of Uncle Ho's soldier.

1. INTRODUCTION

Firstly, the official communication of the soldier Uncle Ho on the one hand follows the principles of administrative communication including regulations, charters...; Ensuring honesty and objectivity; Publicity, democracy; Cautious, balanced responsibility; Ethical standards and harmonization of interests. However, military operations have "dynamic" characteristics, so there are times when the legal nature gives way to combat practice and the division by position and rank gives way to responsibilities and duties (Thao, 2012).

2. METHODOLOGY

This study mainly use qualitative analysis with synthesis and analysis method, with historical views.

Authors also analyze data and statistics (methods) with cases and real examples.

3. MAIN FINDINGS

Based on the hierarchical basis in the organization, functions and roles of commanders with soldiers, this relationship can be divided into two types:

Upper and lower roles:

The pair of commanding officers advising, not directing - direct commanding officers (CBCH1 -

CBCH2).

In relation to the staff of the staff, not the direct commander, the direct commanding officer is the one who informs the situation, advises, the person who directly receives the orders and implements the tasks, and is responsible for the actions. For example: Cuong - Kha, Uncle (Ho Chi Minh) - Officer; Dung Chi - Hong Tan,...

Horizontal role pair (same level):

The pair of soldier-soldier roles (CS - CS) is a pair of roles reflecting the relationship between soldiers and soldiers based on the background of responsibility and duty. These are roles that have a low level of power and the potential to transition into a friendly role. For example: Luy (communication soldier) and Tang (adopted soldier) in Shock; Hiding and Holding/Standing in the Country Rises Up; ...

Due to the impact of narrow circumstances and individual psychology. Ensuring the strict implementation of orders and directives of superiors and flexibility in practical conditions requires the direct commanding officer to be proactive, creative, decisive... However, the external influences context and psychology, emotions such as: feelings of comradeship, friendship have certain influence on the direct commanding officer.

Example 14: - The cannon is not finished. Is the Do side done?

- Finished.

- Regiment news: yesterday destroyed Binh Lieu. The Northeast side's coordination is also a big win. The battalion command sent a message to try. You lie here, I'm going to tell you guys.

c) A pair of CS equal roles (CS - CS)

Surveying 50/127 conversations in the official communication of CS peers, we found that: The main relationship/role in this pair is the power role. The friendly role appears with low frequency. According to the survey results, the CS peer pair mentioned 6/8 topic groups with the difference in frequency of occurrence. The topic that appeared with the highest frequency was the topic of performing duties and combat missions (18/127 times, accounting for 14.2%); Topics of love, friendship, comradeship 11/127 times, accounting for 8.7%. The topic of family, village and future aspirations 7/127 times, accounting for 5.5%; The topic of encouragement and morale before, during and after the battle was 5/127 times, accounting for 3.9%, and Post-war task performance was 3/127 times, accounting for 2.4%. In-depth study of each group of topics in the communication of CS peer pairs can explain the reason:

First, due to the performance of combat duties specified. CS is the person who directly fights on the battlefield. Therefore, in the interaction of CS - CS role pairs, topics about task performance appear with the highest frequency.

4. DISCUSSION AND CONCLUSION

The study has explored several topics of communication including Execution of duties, combat missions; Deploy unit situation, plan and assign tasks; Field inspection, food transport, weapons and weapons ... appear with high frequency in all pairs of roles. Topics that are prone to emotionalization such as: Daily life; Love, friendship, comradeship and family and future aspirations appear with low frequency. The feelings and emotions about love, friendship, comradeship, family, village and future aspirations mixed in reality on the battlefield show the beliefs, will and desire of the communists. for family, home and country.

This is one of the other unique characteristics of Uncle Ho's soldier - the "military family" compared to the army of other regimes (bourgeois, feudal, etc.) - the relationship between the leader and the person being led (Thao, 2012).
