

## **Analysis of Transitivity System in Trump's Inaugural Address**

Abstract: On the basis of transitivity system, this paper attempts to analyze Trump's inaugural address. Based on quantitative analysis and qualitative analysis, this paper aims to divide the speech into six processes, material process, relational process, mental process, existential process, verbal process and behavioral process, and give examples under each process. It is concluded that no matter which process Trump used, the ideas he conveyed are similar. After analyzing the speech, readers can improve sensitivity when reading political studies.

#### 1. INTRODUCTION

In the view of Halliday, three metafunctions exist in systemic grammar. They are the ideational function, the interpersonal function and textual function [1]. The ideational function aims to convey new information to listeners and it includes experiential function and logical function. The interpersonal function is to express the speakers' status, identity, motivation, attitude and his reference, judgment and evaluation of things. The last textual function is to organize language components into discourse on the semantic level. The transitivity system in this paper belongs to ideational function. Its function is to divide what people see, hear and do in the real world into several processes and identify participants and circumstantial elements involved in various processes.

According to Halliday, people can divide human being's experience into six different process types through the transitivity system, which are material process, relational process, behavioral process, verbal process, mental process and existential process.

American presidential election always attracts attention from the whole world. In the presidential election in 2006, Trump became the 45<sup>th</sup> president. As the start of his new status, Trump's inaugural address is of great significance. In this paper, the author would analyze Trump's inaugural address from the perspective of transitivity system.

#### 2. LITERATURE REVIEW

Many scholars have studied Trump's inaugural addresses from various perspectives in the field of linguistic. Based on the theory of Systemic-Functional Grammar, Zhao Mengyan and Zhang Yi [1] did a research on Trump's inaugural addresses from transitivity. Ni Haixiang [2] and Liu Fengmei [3] studied it from Halliday's three metafunctions.

Ni Haixiang [3] asserted that the process which occupied the largest number was the material process while the active non-middle voice was the most voice used. Liu Fengmei [4] paid close attention Trump's speech style and found that Trump frequently applied the cohesive devices.

Others explored Trump's inaugural address by using metaphor, stylistic analysis and identity construction theory.

## 3. METHODS

The author used quantitative analysis and qualitative analysis. Firstly the former one was used to divide the inaugural address, made it clear about which process the sentence belonged to. The later one was used to analyze specific sentence under one process, talk about the meaning and deep implication of the sentence.

#### 4. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In this paper, the author would analyze Trump's inaugural address from two aspects, the distribution and the functions of the six transitivity processes.

#### 4.1 Distribution of the Six Transitivity Process

From the table above, readers can clearly see that there are 176 clauses in Trump's inaugural address. The material processes are the most frequently used and the number of them is 108, taking up 61.4 percent. The relational processes ranked the second among all the processes, whose number is 39 and accounts for 22.2 percent. The third place is taken by mental processes and the number is 11, occupying 6.3 percent. The existential processes follow the mental processes, ranking the fourth. The number is 8 and accounts for 4.5 percent. The number of verbal processes and behavioral processes are the same, each one is 5 and the percentage is 2.8 respectively.

# **4.2** Analysis of six transitivity system process **4.2.1** Material process

Material process is a process of doing something. This process usually includes an actor, an action verb and the goal of the action. The actor is the logical subject of the sentence. The goal is the logical direct object. They are usually nouns or pronouns. If a material process has an actor and a goal of the action, this clause can be either active voice or passive voice. However, if the clause has an actor but no goal of the action, the clause will only have active voice.

In this paper, material process plays the functions of telling the people the purpose of gathering here, describing the current social problems of the United States, identifying the causes of the social problems above, putting forward the solutions to problem in society and planting a bright future for the American people. The author would take examples to carefully explain three of those functions.

Eg. (1) We, the citizens of American, are now joined in a great national effort to rebuild our country and restore its promise for all of our country.

Firstly, Trump used "rebuild" and "restore" to illustrate his tasks after being the president. They are rebuilding America and restoring promise for all people

in the country. As he could not do all things by himself, so he appealed to all Americans to do altogether, he called on all people to accomplish all tasks in a united way. At the beginning of the speech, Trump aimed to build support for himself by the dream of American that they want to revitalize the prosperity of their nation as well as the economic and cultural prosperity.

(2) Mothers and children trapped in poverty in our inner cities, rusted out factories scattered like tombstones across the landscape of our nation, an education system flushed with cash but which leaves our young and beautiful students deprived of all knowledge. And the crime, and the gangs, and the drugs that have stolen too many lives and robbed our country of so much unrealized potential.

Negative words like "trap" "steal" "rob" reappear the ugly situations faced by America. Vulnerable groups like mothers and children are still in poverty, criminal organization and drugs are still threatening people's life safety. Trump emphasized the poverty and life safety that people most concerned. Although these words seem ordinary, they can stimulate the nerves of the audience sensitively. Trump aimed to rouse the ambition of people at ease, evoke the fighting will of Americans for reducing poverty, eliminating the drug and maintaining social stability. By this way, Trump also paved the way for his radical reform.

(3) We must protect our borders from the ravages of other countries making our products, stealing our companies and destroying our jobs.

It shows that in the later days, Trump would make decisions that benefit all Americans, including the national tax, international trade, overseas immigrants, and diplomacy and so on. And by using the three negative words "making" "stealing" and "destroying", Trump aimed to condemn the strong impact on economic and people because of international trade, overseas immigrants and so on. From his words, many people can speculate that his object is China, condemning many Chinese workers find jobs in America, robbing their operating post. In his words, America's high unemployment and slow economic is caused by Chinese workers. It shows clearly that after being the president, he would adopt trade protection, even start a trade war for American's interests without obeying international trade rules. Here, his idea of "America First" shows obviously.

#### **4.2.2 Relational process**

The relational process is the process that reflects the relationship between things, or it can be a process of being or becoming. The relational process has two types: attributive and identifying. The former one refers to which attribute an entity has or which type it belongs to. The latter one identifies two entities'

properties. Each of the two types can be divided into three types: intensive circumstantial and possessive [5].

In this paper, it plays the functions of expressing gratitude, identifying the significance of winning the election, uniting Americans and striving together, showing a negative attitude towards previous politicians and showing determination and goals.

(4) We are grateful to president Obama and First Lady Michelle Obama, for their gracious aid throughout this transition. They have been magnificent.

Trump used relational process to thank for former president Obama and First Lady Michelle for their help in the transfer of power, but never thanked them for their service to the country. In fact, Trump's entire inaugural address was not friendly to politicians, pointing out many social injustices, where made former president Obama somewhat embarrassed at the scene. So people can see Obama's unhappy face when he heard these words.

(5) When America is united, America is totally unstoppable.

Trump encouraged ordinary people to fight for prosperity of the United States; he also affirmed the strength of American people. All they had to do was to unite, and with the fighting spirit of American people, the development of United States would certainly be unstoppable. This was also Trump's hope after he was in power, American people would work with him for a better future.

#### 4.2.3 Mental process

Mental process is a process of reaction, cognition and perception, which is relevant to mental activity. Two participants are involved in mental process, senser and phenomenon.

In this paper, mental process plays the functions of signifying the importance of Trump's winning, calling for the spirit of striving and making promise.

(6) You came by the tens of millions to become part of a historic movement, the likes of which the world has never seen before.

Trump said this was a big day that America has never seen before, and people was about to embark on the days of being the asters of their own country. The audience must feel inspired when they hear these words. By say that, Trump implied that it would be a great change in the whole country, gave all Americans hope, made all of them have confident on the future and obey all new policies.

#### **4.2.4 Existential Process**

Existential process is a process of existing. There is an existent in every existential process. In this paper, existential process plays functions of revealing current social reality, stating the expectation of America and American and calling for action.

(7) This is your day. This is your celebration. And this, the United States of America, is your country.

By using three "this is", it not makes parallelism in from, but also lays the lays the progressive step by step in semantics. Trump aimed to strength that the presidential victory not belong to "myself", a family or a party, it is the victory of all Americans. It is the day that deserves every American to celebrate. Because "I" represent the interest of all people, not just the few. People would have the feeling that it is the same they support Trump as support themselves. This is just another way Trump aimed to win hearts and minds.

(8) At the center of this movement is a crucial conviction -- which a nation exist to serve its citizens. Trump emphasized that "a nation exist to serve its citizens" implying that the government led by him would be a government serving all people, the country led by him would be a country benefiting all people. By showing his ambition, Trump expected Americans can submit to the leadership of the new government and support them.

## 4.2.5 Verbal process

Verbal process is a process of saying to exchange information. Sayer, verbiage and receiver are the main participants. The sayer is not necessarily a person. The common verbs used in verbal process are "tell" "talk" "speak" and so on.

In this paper, verbal process plays the functions of reflecting American values and the style of American politicians.

(9) The Bible tells us how good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity. We must speak our minds openly, debate our disagreement honestly but always pursue solidarity.

Trump quoted from the Bible to illustrate the importance of people's unity. The majority of the American people believe in god, so his words can be more persuasive. Besides, he mentioned the values that the American people have always cherished, such as freedom and honesty.

## 4.2.6 Behavioral process

Behavioral process is a process of being behaving that has something to do with physiological activities. The common verbs used are "laugh" "cry" "dream" and "cough". Only one participant or behavior can be seen in this process, and the behavior is usually human being. In this paper, the behavioral process plays the functions of describing future and equality.

(10) But that is the past and now we are looking only to the future.

From Trump's words, people could see Trump was depicting a bright future for American citizens after he became president. In his other words, he constituented a situation that the United States would be the focus of the world, the voice of American would be heard by everyone, they must dare to dream, and their dreams must be big enough. What they needed to do was just to look to the future. What a beautiful picture! American people were definitely looking forward to it.

#### 5. CONCLUSIONS

Based on the transitivity system, the author analyzed Trump's inaugural address and examples were given under each process. The most often used process by him is material process, relational process ranks second.

While no matter which process is used, the ideas Trump wanted to convey are similar. They are mainly about firstly it is an irresistable trend for "me" to become the president, and by using words like "we" "our", he close the gap between himself and the audience. Secondly, Americans also needed to join in the process of rebuilding and restoring their country, they needed to be unity, to fight for Chinese workers, international trade, overseas immigrants and so on. Thirdly, the new government would try best to serve people from all classes. And America would have a bright future under their leadership. Fourthly, he ignored the achievement made by Obama, stressed himself and his government all the way.

From this paper, it proves the maneuverability and practicability of transitivity system in inaugural address. People can find the deepen meaning, political end and ideology of Trump by analyzing his speech. This is a way to improve readers' sensitivity when reading political studies.
